# 1. Activity Development of a Business Plan for Winnie Madikizela-Mandela Manufacturing Hubs 2. Duration The project timeframe for the business plan is two months from the date of appointment Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local Municipality is situated within Alfred Nzo District Municipality in 3. Introduction & the EC Province, It is located on the R61 road connecting the Kwazulu Natal (KZN) South Coastal Background Boundary to the N2 highway. The municipality stretches between the Umtamvuna and Mtentu Rivers, which boasts valuable flora and fauna found nowhere else in the world. It is also home to one of the greatest sons of Africa, Oliver Reginald Tambo, who was a revolutionary leader and the longest-serving ANC president. Mbizana prides itself on a cultural diversity that includes a variety of tribes such as the Xhosa's, Mpondo's, Sotho's and Nguni's. However the population is dominated by the Mpondo tribe, which has its own unique dialect, isiMpondo, a soft mixture of isiXhosa and isiZulu. The municipality is made up of thirty one (31) Wards that a spread over a geographic area of 2 806 km<sup>2</sup>. Winnie Madikizela-Mandela Local Municipality (WMMLM) in partnership with the Alfred Nzo District Municipality (ANDM) is implementing the Winnie Madikizela-Manufacturing hubs project located within the jurisdiction of the local municipality. This is a strategic project which seeks to reduce leakages prevailing within the manufacturing sector. Ward 4, ward 8 and ward 16 have been identified as suitable and strategic wards for this project and sites have been identified within these wards. The project will be implemented in the three wards subject to compliant feasibility studies. The main objective of the project is to intensify the level of production in the manufacturing sector in order to significantly improve the local and district economy, create job opportunities for the unemployed, reduce economic leakages and in turn increase contribution of the manufacturing sector to the GDP. The envisioned hubs will be technology driven and it is anticipated that the project will create 200 jobs during construction and operational phase.



# 4. Needs & Objectives

The municipality is looking for a detailed business plan. The business plan will serve as a key point of reference for investors, operators, employees, board and management to gauge progress against objectives. The business plan will also be used for sourcing of additional funds.

The specifics objectives of the project;

- Capacity building of previously disadvantaged communities.
- Significantly reduce leakages prevailing within the manufacturing sector, and assist in ensuring that revenue circulates within the local and district's economy.
- Create an enabling environment for the development of small businesses through enhancing the skills base for SMMEs operating in the manufacturing and construction sectors;
- Contribute 200 job creation opportunities within the District.
- To increase income generation for Mbizana and surrounding communities
