Purpose

This communique serves to request your good office to authorise the Employee Wellness section to co-ordinate the training of the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) committee members as well as OHS Representatives of Winnie Madikizela-Mandela Local Municipality.

Background

Consequent to the visit from the Department of Labour, one of the findings that posed a threat of a fine from the commissioner was the non-adherence to the OHS Act, which was the non-existence of the relevant structures to oversee and support this function.

The Occupational Health and Safety Act 85 of 1993, stipulates that every employer must establish a Health and Safety Committee for the purpose of initiating, maintaining and reviewing occupational measures to improve the health and safety of employees in the environment they are working under, as well as the safety of those that are within the municipal premises.

Content

The OHS Committee was then formulated following the appropriate guide and has been functioning since August 2021 and representatives per section/department were also elected. An induction of all members in both structures was conducted by the Department of Labour soon after the formulation.

In order for these structures to be fully functional, its composition should be well equipped in knowledge and provided with the skill on implementing the requirements of the OHS whilst understanding the regulations of each sector i.e. the differentiation of workplaces.

The training should expose members to the following:-

- i. Understanding the requirements of the Act;
- ii. Be able to conduct an internal audit objectively;
- iii. Develop a checklist;
- iv. Be able to present findings;
- v. Compile reports and conduct follow-up audits; and
- vi. Implementation of the complete health and safety management system.

- iv) If the B-BBEE status level of contributor has been claimed or obtained on a fraudulent basis or any of the conditions of contract have not been fulfilled, the purchaser may, in addition to any other remedy it may have
 - (a) disqualify the person from the bidding process;
 - recover costs, losses or damages it has incurred or suffered as a result of that person's conduct;
 - (c) cancel the contract and claim any damages which it has suffered as a result of having to make less favourable arrangements due to such cancellation;
 - (d) recommend that the bidder or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted by the National Treasury from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the audi alteram partem (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
 - (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution.
