NAME OF THE PROJECT: BUSINESS MANAGEMENT CAPACITY BUILDING AND SUPPORT FOR WHOLESALERS AND RETAILERS

1. INTRODUCTION OF THE PROJECT

Wholesalers and retailers are an essential component of the South African rural economy as they provide vital goods, employment and an income to most rural dwellers. Despite this, the sustainability of wholesale and retailers particularly spaza shops has been problematic, with most closing down within the first few years of operation. This further increased by the influx or foreign operated spaza shops who are able to work together and buy in bulk. The needs analysis conducted by the municipality in the first quarter identifies existing gaps in the sector and recommends spaza shops form a structure where they can share ideas and lobby government for support. The structure would enable spaza shops to access funding from government schemes and private investors alike so that their operations are expanded. Spaza shops are classified as informal SMMEs, spaza shops make up a huge percentage of the proportion of our rural economy. Under the current challenging economic environment in South Africa, characterized by a rising cost of living and unemployment, spaza shops offer a viable alternative livelihood for many residents in our area.

2. REQUEST

Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local Municipality seeks to procure services of a suitable and experienced service provider to plan and provide NQF level 4 accredited training in business management and board leadership for wholesalers and retailers.

3. OBJECTIVES

- To ensure capacity development of retail and wholesales
- Improve business management skills of retail and wholesalers
- Improve board leadership skills of owners.
- Improve performance and productivity of retail and wholesalers by reinforcing existing competencies and developing new skills

4. THE TRAINING COURSE SHOULD MEET THE FOLLOWING MINIMUM CRITERIA

- Engage participants in simulating relevant and realistic challenges for practicing and applying the material in their areas.
- Encourage participants to use brief presentations, demonstrations, engage them in innovative and interactive practical sessions.
- Provide feed-back and training on the relevant skills and processes.
