1.Sector to be Community Structures for Manufacturing Hubs Capacitated Winnie Madikizela-Mandela Local Municipality (WMMLM) in partnership with the Alfred Nzo District 2. Introduction & Municipality (ANDM) is implementing the Winnie Madikizela-Manufacturing hubs project located Background with the jurisdiction of the local municipality. This is a strategic project which seeks to reduce leakages prevailing within the manufacturing sector, 3 areas which includes Mpisi, Bholorhweni and Dudumeni have been identified as suitable and strategic for the implementation of this project. The project will be implemented in the three wards subject to compliant feasibility studies. The main objective of the project is to intensify the level of production in the manufacturing sector in order to significantly improve the local and district economy, create job opportunities for the unemployed, reduce economic leakages and in turn increase contribution of the manufacturing sector to the GDP.
