#### INTRODUCTION

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) provides the capability to collect, manage, manipulate, analyze and share location-based information. It is an integral part of the decision support infrastructure that can significantly contribute to planning and informed decision-making regarding service delivery. GIS is also a critical tool that supports a number of municipal legislative requirements contained in the Municipal Systems Act (No. 32 of 2000), the Municipal Structures Act (No. 117 of 1998), the Spatial Data Infrastructure Act (No. 54 of 2003), and the Property Rates Acts (no. 6 of 2004).

It is against this background that the Winnie Madikizela-Mandela Local Municipality is in a process of upgrading the GIS web portal/website. It is a link found in the municipal website but hosted on internet externally.

#### **PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT**

The municipality has developed a GIS web portal in 2014/15 financial year, which is a web viewer tool for the public and every user interested to view information on certain features and even create/print maps. The GIS web portal is accessible through a link available in the municipal website, however, the portal is hosted on internet externally since the municipality does not have a GIS server or rather an enough space to host the web portal internally.

A lot has happened over the years, changes such as, the municipality name change, additional immovable assets and other visible spatial data.
