3. Introduction & Background	Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local Municipality is situated within Alfred Nzo District Municipality in the EC Province. It is located on the R61 road connecting the Kwazulu Natal (KZN) South Coastal Boundary to the N2 highway. The municipality stretches between the Umtamvuna and Mtentu Rivers, which boasts valuable flora and fauna found nowhere else in the world. It is also home to one of the greatest sons of Africa, Oliver Reginald Tambo, who was a revolutionary leader and the longest-serving ANC president. Mbizana prides itself on a cultural diversity that includes a variety of tribes such as the Xhosa's, Mpondo's, Sotho's and Nguni's. However the population is dominated by the Mpondo tribe, which has its own unique dialect, isiMpondo, a soft mixture of isiXhosa and isiZulu. The municipality is made up of thirty two (32) Wards that spread over a geographic area of 2 806 km².
	The municipality is looking for detailed business plan for Skhombe Campsite. The business plan will be used to source funding for the project. The site is a short walk to the beach and far from the communal area and is ideal for the campsite. There is no infrastructure available. The components that are required for the campsite are water supply, ablution block with sewer system; sink for dish wash, washing line, reception, lawn and braai places. Water sources are available for this campsite. The road improvements for that will be improved for Mtentu will also benefit this campsite because they are not located far apart. The target market for this campsite will be Adventure tourists which are 4x4 users and available already in the Camp SA pool. This market always wants new

experiences and destinations and they camp for a minimum of a week to three weeks. The proposed site can accommodate up to 30 campsites.

There are several business models that may be suitable for the operation of this site: Concession, Private Public Partnership or Agent Management. The Community Trust should be considered as the structure to manage the operation of this hiking trail.

4. Implementation Schedule

The business plan must outline the ideal implementation methodology for such a project, including a schedule of activities to be carried out including all the prerequisites.

5. Evaluation Criteria

Prospective bidders in their proposals are to set out their approach, methodology and develop clear milestones against which progress can be monitored and payments made.
